# Reysol & Rangers steer clear of dangers

 Suwon Samsung **2/3**  Rangers FC  
 Kashiwa Reysol **2/1**  FC Barcelona

## OVER 2,000 YOUNGSTERS HAVE FEATURED IN AL KASS INTERNATIONAL CUP SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 2012.

### WHICH OF THEM WOULD MAKE IT INTO AN ALL-TIME AL KASS 11? ANALYSTS NICK SUMMERBEE (NS) AND CHRIS MAKIN (CM) TRY TO DECIDE...

**CM** This is a really tough assignment, Nick.

**NS** Yes it is. When you think of all the amazing footballers we've seen here over the years, it's almost impossible to narrow it down to 11.

**CM** I know – and there are some fantastic players who won't even get a mention, because I think the only way to approach this task is to only include players who have gone on to make it at the highest level.

So, in goal, we've got two choices – Francis Uzoho, who used to play for Aspire International, and went on to play in the World Cup in 2018 in Russia for Nigeria; or you've got Kokubo, who used to play for Kashiwa Reysol. He played here in three tournaments, and he's just gone to Benfica.

**NS** I would say Kokubo.

**CM** So you're going for Kokubo, who's gone to Benfica but not actually played for them; over a goalkeeper who's played in the World Cup.

**NS** But where is Uzoho playing now? He's on loan for Omonia in Cyprus, whereas I think Kokubo has a big future ahead of him. Also, I think he's the only player to appear in three separate Al Kass tournaments – in 2016, 2017 and 2018 – and he put in several match-winning performances here, so he gets my vote.

**CM** Moving on to left-back, and I think Leo Pele is the outstanding candidate. He played for the cup-winning Fluminense side here in 2013, and went on to establish himself as a regular in the first team. He's been out on loan recently, but he's got bags of talent.

**NS** Agreed. And I don't think there's much dispute about the centre-back pairing either. Kimpembe, who played for PSG here in 2013.

**CM** Yes, I remember him – and he's gone on to play regularly for the first team too. He scored in the Champions League against Man United last season, but then gave a penalty away in the famous return game.

**NS** That's right. And alongside him it's got to be Dan-Axel Zagadou. Another PSG youth player, he was here in 2014, and is now at Borussia Dortmund.

**CM** It's interesting that you'd put Zagadou ahead of Eder Militao, who was here with Sao Paulo in 2015 – he was Zidane's first signing on his return to management at Real Madrid, and cost 50 million Euros.

**NS** True, but he hasn't played much since then, has he? Zagadou gets my vote because he was so impressive in the 2014 PSG side that played here.

**CM** OK, so moving to right-back, and again we've got a tough choice. Ashraf Hakimi, who played here for Real Madrid in 2014, and is now on loan at Borussia Dortmund. Or, Moussa Wague, who was part of the Aspire International winning team in 2014, and was subsequently signed by Barcelona.

**NS** Both of them played in the 2018 Russia World Cup too. Hakimi turned out for Morocco, and Wague for Senegal – and he became the youngest African player to ever score in the finals. Having said that, he's not had much game time with Barca, and he's just gone on loan to Nice.

**CM** True, and Hakimi is doing really well at Dortmund – he's their first choice right back these days, so let's go for him.

Now for the midfield. We've got one for you – Brahim Diaz, who played for your team, Man City, in 2014.

**NS** Yes, I remember him. Very clever midfielder. He's back in Spain now with Real Madrid.

**CM** We'll put him on the right side of midfield, and in the middle of the park we've got Adrien Rabiot.

**NS** What a player. He played for PSG in the first Al Kass tournament back in 2012, and it was obvious then that he had what it takes to go all the way. He's had a couple of dips in his career since then, but seems to be back on track at Juventus now.

**CM** And on the left of midfield – although he's naturally a central midfielder – is Oscar, who played here for Real Madrid in 2014 and 2015.

**NS** That's right – he ran that Madrid side. Where is he these days?

**CM** He's still on Real's books, but he's on loan at Leganes. That just goes to show how difficult it is for young players to make the breakthrough at Madrid. It's been the same story for Hakimi, because they tend to just go out and buy the best players around.

Now, up front on the right, we've got a couple of options. Kingsley Coman, who was with PSG in 2012 – doing really well with Bayern Munich these days. Or Kenedy, who won the tournament with Fluminense in 2013. Chelsea signed him, but he's spent the last few years out on loan.

**NS** It's got to be Coman. It's not easy to get in that Bayern team, and he's so dangerous when he gets on the ball. And, when you look back over the history of Al Kass, Kingsley Coman is still the one that everyone talks about.

**CM** ON the left-hand side of attack we've got Mousse Dembele or Akram Afif.

**NS** Well, when you think about what Aspire is all about, you can't look further than Afif. He was the star of the Asian Cup last year.

**CM** Even though Dembele's played for Celtic and Lyon?

**NS** Yes – Afif sums up what the Al Kass tournament is all about.

**CM** OK - Akram Afif goes in. So the last choice now is for centre forward, and it's between Patrick Cutrone, who played for AC Milan here in 2014 and went on to play for their first team, then signed for Wolves and is now on loan back at Fiorentina. Or Odsonne Edouard, another former PSG player who is now at Celtic scoring a bag full of goals.

**NS** Edouard – I think he was one of the best strikers we've seen here. You can see how strong PSG have been down the years at Al Kass by the number of their players in this line-up. There are five in the all-time 11.

**CM** True, but the fact that only one of them – Kimpembe - is still at PSG, shows just how difficult it is to make the step up from youth team to first team at your hometown club.

# REIGNING CHAMPIONS RANGERS SNATCH LATE WINNER TO KNOCK UNLUCKY SUWON

Reigning champions Glasgow Rangers grabbed a last-gasp winner to send battling Koreans Suwon Samsung out of contention for the Al Kass International Cup.

Suwon had led in both of their games, but fail to reach the knock-out stage after defeats to Aspire Academy (3-1) and now Rangers (3-2).

The Koreans twice took the lead but after grabbing a 77th minute equalizer they pushed for a winner and it was player of the match Charlie Lindsay who snatched it in the 93rd minute.

Suwon had the better of the early exchanges and Cheolgyu Han outpaced Bobby Dean to latch onto a long ball but Jack McConnell in goal for Rangers pulled off a fine save.

In a game of few chances, Suwon hit the post of the half-hour mark when Jihun Yoon sent in a high cross from the right and as Han tried to connect with his head, the ball deceived him and the keeper before hitting the post.

The opening goal came on 34 minutes when Seongjin Lee, who had just been booked, connected beautifully with a low drive from outside of the box. There was no apparent danger when he received the ball but he easily held off Leyton Dunlop and went

past Connor Allan before letting fly to beat McConnell at the near post.

Suwong deserved their half-time lead, having enjoyed 55% possession and had five shots to Rangers' one, but the Scots started the second half much better.

They equalised on 48th minute when Lindsay burst into the box and unselfishly pulled the ball back for skipper Robbie Ure to fire home. Ure has already featured in Rangers' reserve team this season, which is not unusual as the Glasgow club tend to play a lot of their youngsters at a higher group to speed up their development.

Rangers almost added a second when the influential Lindsay held off Jeyi Lee but saw his shot saved. As Rangers pushed for a second, Scottish youth international Dire Mebude – whose elder brother Dapo is one of the best young talents at the club, fired a powerful shot that was saved with the ball then just deceiving Ure.

Suwong took the lead again on 65 minutes with a rather fortuitous goal. Han had a great chance to score but Kelsey Ewen lunged to block his effort, only for Mohsen Al Sharshani to point to the spot. Sangmin Lee took the spot kick but tried a Penanka which lacked the height and McConnell really should have

saved it.

Rangers levelled when Harkness sent a harmless high ball into the box and the keeper, under no pressure, opted to punch but made a mess of it and Icelandic youngster Johannes Bjarnason headed into an empty net, despite the efforts of Jongseok Yu to reach it.

Substitute Francis Jacobs, who only linked up with the club five days earlier after joining on loan from their American partner club Orange County, almost found Mebude with a wonderful chip as he displayed the ability that saw him become the youngest professional footballer in US history.

Rangers finished strongly with Ure seeing a powerful shot saved and Jacobs then setting up Mebude who fired into the side netting.

Hyunjin almost paid the price for his tendency to punch when he again opted not to catch and Lindsay almost caught him out with a lob that the keeper scrambled back to catch. But Lindsay made no mistake when gifted a 93rd minute tap-in after Ure's attempted pass ricocheted into his path.

## KASHIWA REYSOL PULL OFF A STUNNING VICTORY OVER BARCELONA

FC Barcelona failed to get off to a winning start on their return to the Al Kass International Cup as they came up against determined Japanese outfit Kashiwa Reysol.

Former runners-up Kashiwa, beaten 3-0 by Paris St Germain in their opener, were ahead after just 45 seconds as Barca suffered a nightmare start with goalkeeper Alejandro Pinazo putting through his own net.

Receiving a back-pass, he went to clear the ball upfield only to slice the ball and he looked on with embarrassment as it looped back over his head and into the net.

After that, it was all Barcelona and Jan Coca, whose twin brother Jordi was also in the Barca line-up, went down under a challenge

from keeper Takuni Itoh outside of the box but Referee Saoud Al Qathani waved play on.

Had a free-kick been given, Itoh could well have seen red as he was the last man but the Japanese side were relieved that nothing was given.

Although dominating possession, Barca were not creating many chances but Antonio Comino – better known simply as Toni - did test the keeper with a long-range effort.

Minutes later, Ryoga Tanaka went close with a free-kick for Kashiwa but it came as no surprise when Aleix Garrido equalised with a well-taken goal on 32 minutes. He sent Jordi away down the right and the ball was pulled

back perfectly for Garrido to fire home.

Jordi almost went from provider to scorer minutes later with a low driver that Itoh got his hands to and the ball bobbled towards goal only to go out for a corner. From the resulting flag-kick Marc Jurado got a header on target but the keeper had it covered.

Jan Coca almost put the Spaniards ahead just before half-time but his effort was comfortably saved by Itoh. There was still time for Toni to go close before the break but he didn't do enough to worry the keeper and the sides remained level.

Barca started the second half just as the ended the opening period, and Toni crashed a volley against the post on 49 minutes.

Ryunosuke Hanahatsu saw an attempted clearance hit his own bar before bouncing onto the line before going clear.

The skillful Jan Coca was causing Kashiwa all kinds of problems and Toru Nishimura threw himself into a challenge to deny the Spaniard and he almost put through his own goal.

Kashiwa had a great chance on 70 minutes when substitute Shoma Kurita had too much pace for Gerard Hernandez and went clear but Pinazo threw out his left leg to make a fine save, atoning for his first minute mistake.

At the other end of the pitch substitute, Iker Bravo tried his luck with a spectacular overhead kick that had the keeper beaten but hit the post.

The Spaniards were stunned though when Kashiwa took the lead on 86 minutes. Ota Yamamoto sent in a free-kick and skipper Go Otsuki went down in the box under a reckless challenge by Toni, leaving the referee with no alternative but to point to the spot. Pinazo threw himself to the right to pull off a fine save from Yamamoto, who followed up to score.

It was a stunning win for Kashiwa and leaves Barca needing to defeat Paris St Germain on Monday to stay in the competition.
